



Six Mountaineers Make All-Conference

Kings Mountain High placed six players on the All-Southwestern 3-A Conference football team announced last week.

Representing the Mountaineers were running back Jeff Lockhart, punter Kevin Moss, offensive lineman Eugene Morgan, defensive linemen Victor Bell and Jermaine Grier, and outside linebacker D.J. Williams.

Running back Maurice Wilkie of East Rutherford was named Player of the Year and East Rutherford's first-year coach Bill Smothers was Coach of the Year.

East Rutherford led in All-Conference selections with nine. Wilkie was selected as an offensive back and defensive inside linebacker. He was joined on the team by offensive linemen Allen Prescott and Chance '3aynard; offensive back Robert Gray, kicking specialist-defensive lineman Aaron Camp, offensive back and defensive inside linebacker Rodney Hines, and defensive backs Wendell Camp, Dennis Logan and T.G. Baker.

Second place Burns had seven players on the team, including offensive linemen Jerome Toms and Dwayne Costner, running back Melvin Montgomery, wide receiver Gerard Lee, inside linebackers Mark Hush and Shion Strong, and outside linebacker Lamont Wells.
