Break-In Suspect Arrested Inside Clyde Short Company

Kings Mountain police surprised an unsuspecting break-in suspect Sunday morning while searching a warehouse after they found a broken padlock.
 As they turned on the lights for a closer look, Sgt. Derek Johnson said they heard the sound of an elevator coming down from the building's second floor. The elevator delivered a break-in suspect who apparently thought he was alone in the building.
 Lewis Ward Johnson II, 25, of Gastonia, was charged with felonious breaking and entering and entry into real property. He was jailed under \$10,000 secured bond.
 According to Sgt. Johnson's report, Sunday morning about 7:30, Sgt. Johnson, along with Officers Joel Hendrick Jr. and Bob Myers,

responded to a silent alarm that went off at the Clyde A. Short Co. warehouse on Phenix Street. The former Phenix Mill is used by Short to store household items Sgt. Johnson estimated was worth more than \$1 million.
 When officers heard the elevator, they waited. "We had to command the suspect to drop what he had in his hand. He was scared to death," said Sgt. Johnson.
 Nothing was missing from the warehouse, according to police. "The suspect was basically looking around to find out where everything was," Sgt. Johnson said.
