gested ward lines at the April 30 meeting. Their approval of required redistricting makes more likely the possibility that elections in the city can be held later this year.

A new ward map, based on population distribution figures released by the U. S. Census Bureau last month, will be displayed at the council meeting.

Populations in Kings Mountain's six districts and their city council representatives are as follows: District I, Al Moretz, whose term expires this year, 803.

District II, Elvin Greene, 1,064. District III, Norma Bridges, whose term expires this year, 1857. District IV, Jackie Barrett, whose term expires this year, 1592. District V, Fred Finger, 1,536.

Kings Mountain lost population in the 1991 census. The final census figures were 8,763 with 77.7 percent white, 20.4 percent black and 1.9 percent American Indian, Asian, Hispanic. The total white population is 6,812 and the total black population is 1,791.

District VI, Scott Neisler, 1,883.

Federal law allows populations to differ as much as 5 percent among voting districts.

Once the public hearing is held on April 11 and the city board takes action on April 30 the city has until July 5 to receive U.S. Justice Department approval in order to conduct elections as scheduled this fall. If approval is not received on time, elections could be postponed for seven months until 1992 and the city council passed a resolution last month that would allow for the postponement, which is authorized by state law.

"Our whole board is saying that

it's possible elections can be held on schedule," said Cook. "We want everyone to come out at the public hearing and hope that we can be positive on a choice to present to city council at the regular meeting April." Once the public hearing is held, the job of the election board will be to draw lines for the other wards and the minority ward," she said.

Members of the redistricting committee also include all six city commissioners, the elections board, which also includes James Carroll and Philip Hager and Jim Childers and Annie Thombs from the community at large.

Cook said the committee is touching all the bases. Based on the results of the public hearing, she says the committee will be ready to move ahead, give the U. S. Justice Department the information they need, and move on with the city elections on schedule.
