## **County to handle transportation** for Kings Mountain Aging Program

The city is consolidating with use of administrative staff as the county its transportation services for residents in the aging program at the Depot, effective May 1.

Aging Director Monty Thornburg said that the cost of transportation will be less and consolidation will mean that the program will always have drivers.

Thornburg said the estimated cost of transportation for 1991-92 with Transportation Administration of Cleveland County will be between \$31,600-\$38,240 for contract services and \$13,000 for transportation coordinator's salary. Thornburg told city council at the recent meeting that the savings could be more than \$7,000 and more importantly than financial savings potentially a consolidated system will address such present problems as securing/retaining qualified drivers and eliminating


