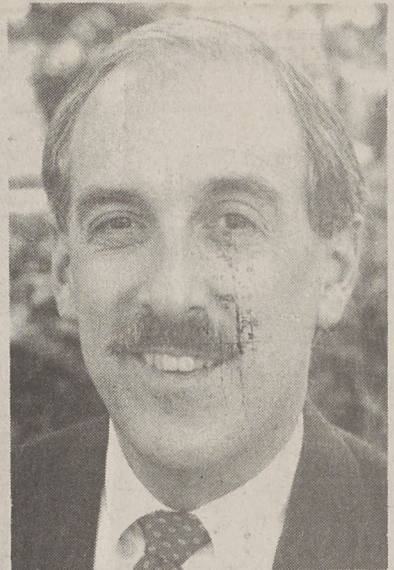

She is a N. C. certified marital and family therapist and is a clinical member of the American Association for Marriage and Family therapy. She is certified as a parent effectiveness instructor, youth effectiveness instructor, transactional analysis instructor and active parenting instructor.

Dr. Mitcham has written several publications. She presents workshops on a variety of topics of interest in today's complex world. She is married to Dr. L. William Mitcham and has two married children and three grandchildren. She has served as past president of Lutheran Coalition for Life Enrichment Education.
