

First-aid for nosebleeds

In most cases, nosebleeds are triggered by some trauma to the nose, such as a bump or blow from

the outside or a wayward finger inside. Blowing

pressure by gently squeezing your nose for at least five minutes. If bleeding persists, moisten a

tissue with over-the-counter medicated nasal spray or drops that contain *phenylephrine* to help shrink the blood vessels. Pack the tissue into the

nostril, and again apply steady pressure.


