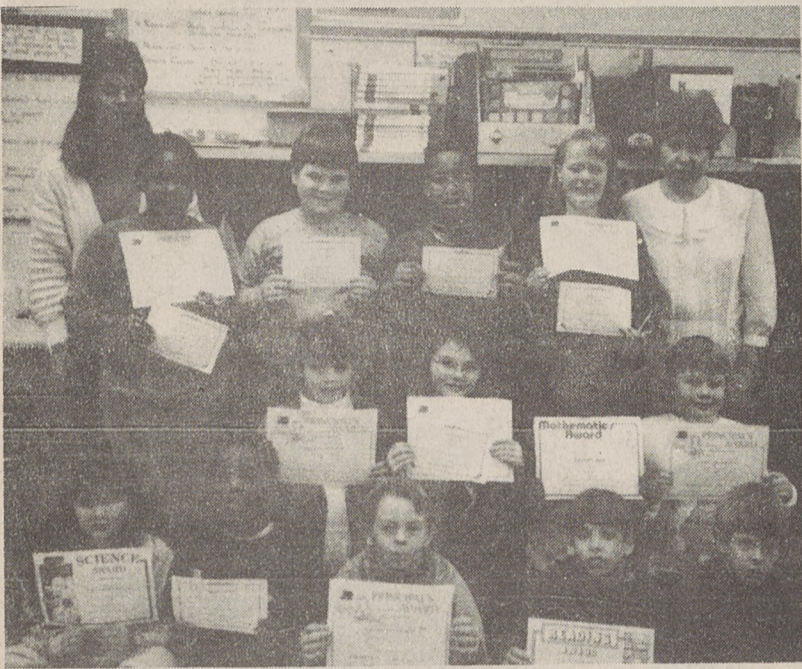


Courses set at Cleveland College
