Church women support KM Crisis Ministry

Since its organization in 1986 women from eight churches in the Kings Mountain Council of Church Women have given \$1,602.60 to support the Crisis Ministry, a Bible teacher in the schools, tornado victims through donations to the American Red Cross, and the Literacy Council.

Jan Neisler, a leader in the Council, says that all offerings received at annual meetings go to local charities. This year's offering on May 7 at First Baptist Church will be received for the Crisis Ministry and other community charities.

The May 7 dinner is open to all women in the eight sponsoring churches and to guests. First Baptist Church will seat 250 people for dinner and Neisler hopes this year's event will attract its biggest crowd ever. Sponsoring churches are First Baptist, Kings Mountain Baptist, Boyce Memorial ARP, Central United Methodist, Christ the King Catholic, First Presbyterian, and Resurrection and St. Matthew's Lutheran Churches.

Tickets, now on sale at \$5, are available at the sponsoring church offices.
