■ Aerobics - Monday, Wednesday and Friday, 8:40-9:40 a.m.; Monday, Wednesday and Friday, 9:45-10:45 a.m.; Monday, Wednesday and Thursday, 5:30-6:30 p.m.; Monday-Thursday, 6:30-7:30 p.m. The fee is \$10 for inside city residents and \$15 for outside city residents. Register between the first and fifth of each month.

■ Water aerobics - Monday, Wednesday and Friday, 11 a.m.-12 noon, Neisler Natatorium. The fee is \$10 for senior citizens, \$15 for inside city residents and \$22.50 for outside city residents.

■ Youth and adult tennis - A new program of group tennis instruction will begin soon at Deal Street Park. The two-week lessons will cost \$18 for youth and \$23 for adults.

■ Swimming lessons - Swim lessons for ages 1-12 years will be held June 15-26, July 6-17 and July 27-August 7. There is a fee. Deal Street pool will open June 6.

■ Oil painting class - An oil painting class is held the third Saturday of each month. The fee is \$30.

■ Moss Lake swim beach - The swim beach at Moss Lake will open Saturday, May 23 from 12 noon-6 p.m., and on Sunday, May 24, from 1-6 p.m. The weekend schedule will remain in effect until June 2.

■ Baseball camp - Registration is underway for the third annual baseball camp for ages 8-17. It will be held June 15-19 from 9 a.m.-4 p.m. Bag lunches are required.
