years of independence this nation has enjoyed since the signing of the Declaration of Independence in 1776.

There is no admission charge and the public is invited. In event of rain, the concert will be held in the Visitor Center Auditorium at the same time.

The 45 members of the band

represent many vocational and professional activities and its history extendes to the America Revolution when fifes and drums were used. During the Civil War, bugles were added.

Chief Warrant Officer Michael C. Stevens has directed the band since 1947.

In 1978 the Band received the

honor of serving as the Official Military Band for the United States Military Academy, West Point New York, for two weeks. It was the first National Guard band to receive this honor.


