

Oak View burns note on building

Nearly seven years after they signed a note to borrow \$65,000 to complete a \$124,000 fellowship hall members of Oak View Baptist Church marked the note "paid in full" at a note-burning ceremony Sunday.

The service was a highlight of annual Homecoming Day at the York Road church which attracted one of the largest crowds ever.

Guest speakers during the 11 a.m. worship hour were former pastors Rev. Robbie Moore, who delivered the sermon, and Rev. Ed Sessom. Rev. Ralph Sparrow, pastor of the church, led the note-burning ceremonies.

David Caldwell was chairman of the successful building fund-raising effort and Dean Fleming is chairman of the board of deacons.

Caldwell said the church is currently raising money to purchase a new organ for the sanctuary.

"This is a great day for Oak View," said Sparrow, who said the 200-member congregation borrowed money in September 1985 to complete the spacious addition.

"Grow in your grace experiences," said Sessom, who challenged the congregation to "keep on." More than \$3,000 was added to the special funds and to the regular offerings during the worship service.

After the worship hour, picnic lunch was spread in the fellowship hall and there were no empty chairs at the tables.

Delores White directed the church choir in a special song service during the afternoon.

The project area takes in several hundred homes on Scism Road, Oak Grove Road, Gold Run Subdivision, Ebenezer Road, a portion north of Highway 216, south from Mary's Grove Road and the northern part of Bell Road.

The meeting is part of an expansion project by the water authority and is intended only for those potential water customers living in the designated areas.

By 1996 Richardson says the expansion effort will reach about 8,000 households along an approximate 500 miles of water main.

"Our main intent is to try to as much as possible, contact everyone to see if they want to participate or not," said Richardson, manager of the authority formed in 1983 as the Upper Cleveland County Sanitary District. In 1989, the water authority merged with Piedmont Metropolitan Water District and the name was changed to Cleveland County Sanitary District. The water authority is governed by a seven-member board of commissioners who are elected by county residents.

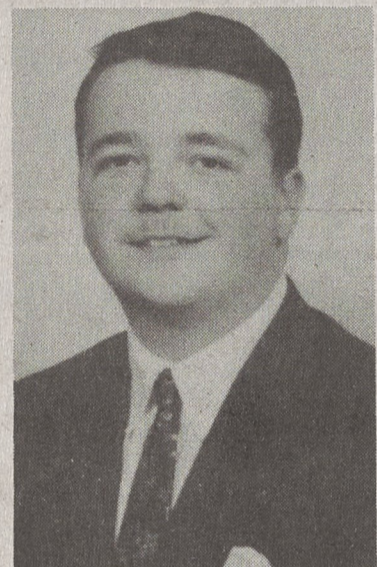
Hawkins ministerial student

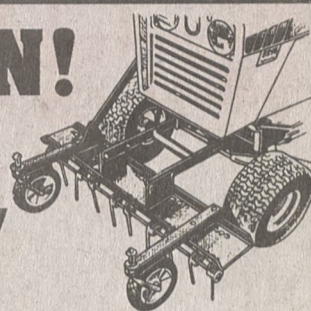
