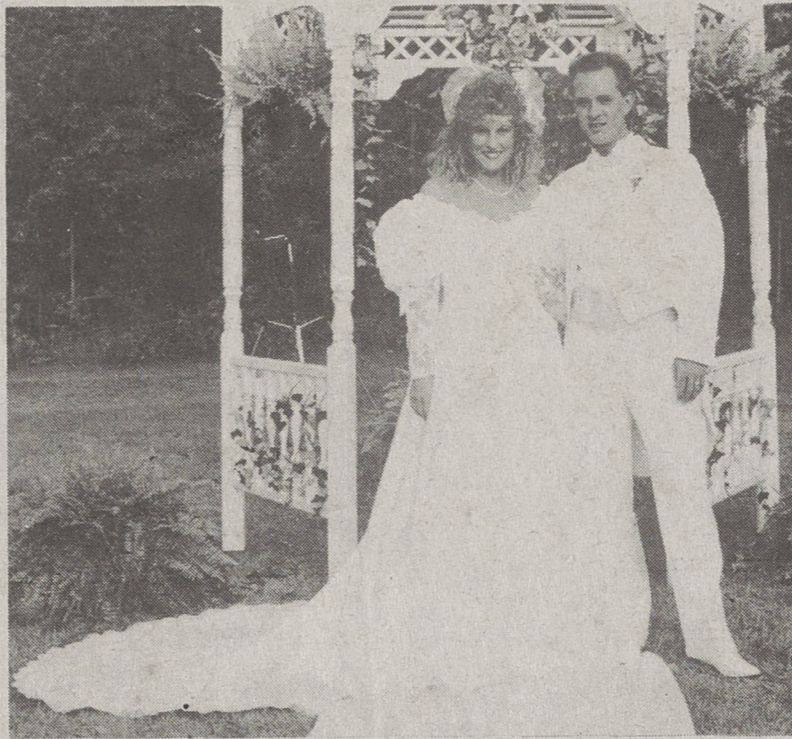
A reception was hosted by parents of the bride and bridegroom at Lucille Tatum Hall.

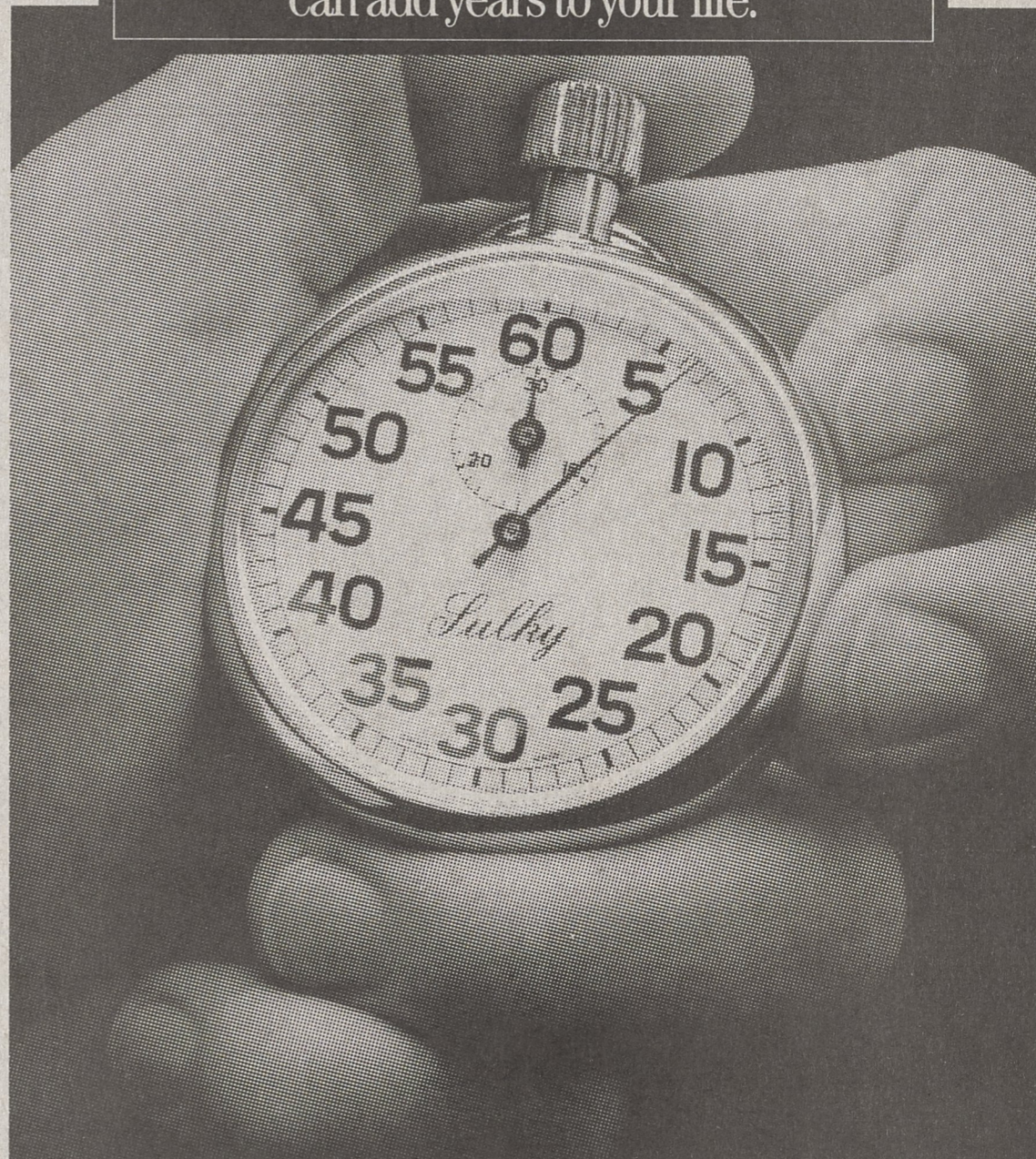
Registration at Cleveland College
