Given the state personnel laws regarding public employees, neither the specific infractions nor the disciplinary action can be made public. However, we do not believe the infractions suggest any serious problems within the department. We also believe that overall the electric department is functioning well, and has saved the city a considerable amount of money on the recent bond improvements."

Hambright, who was fired June 26 for failure to observe proper safety procedures, said he and other employees were allowed to play basketball and other activities on city time.

Hambright lost his job after a transformer fell from a city truck but he said neither of the two other employees on the job were disciplined.

City officials say Hambright was the crew member responsible for tying the equipment. Damages amounted to \$1,000.

Wood said Kings Mountain, and most cities, use inclement weather days when electric, street, and public works crews aren't on the streets for safety training classes and for clean-up duty. Inclement weather, he said, intensifies power outages, tree limbs in lines have to be removed, and employees in every department of the city must be ready for emergency situations.

about five years. After completing bereavement classes and talking with other people who had lost loved ones, she said she found it easier to return to her job and also to return to church and sit in the familiar pew she had shared with her husband.

"Hospice and our church have helped me to cope," said Pearl who was married nearly 47 years to Booty Hammett, who got that nickname from his young brother trying to say "brother."

Pearl Dixon and Booty Hammett met at Griffin Drug Store in 1944. Booty had been wounded in the Army in the legs and had been using crutches. She saw him sitting on a Coca Cola crate and it was love at first sight. After his hitch with Uncle Sam in World War II they were married and started housekeeping in a little house on Cherokee Street. Pearl worked at Hightower's Store for 14 years and Hammett worked at Foote Mineral Company.

Hammett said the support of her close-knit family helped her "get through the bad times." The family includes two daughters, Ann, who is married to Rick Harmon of Myrtle Beach, and Teresa, who is married to Joe Williams of King Mountain, and three grandsons, Greg Williams, a student at Liberty University; Blair Williams, a student at KMHS, and Ryan Wood, a student at Myrtle Beach, SC High School.

Hospice of Cleveland County served 168 patients, a 16 percent increase, in 1991, and admitted 135 patient/families, giving 11,719 days of care compared with 10,938 days of care in 1990. Forty-one new volunteers were trained and added to the volunteer roster.
