

CROP walk scheduled October 25

CROP Walk (Christian Rural Overseas Project) 1992 has been set for Sunday, October 25. Rain date is November 1.

Chairman David Dellinger is putting out a plea to area churches and businesses to help this year's effort. The goal is to have 300 walkers and raise over \$7,000.

CROP Walk is a 10 K (6.2 mile) walk in which individuals get pledges per kilometer in order to

raise money for world hunger.

"As important as world charities are, it is more important to note that 25 percent of the money raised remains in Kings Mountain and supports our local Crisis Ministry," Dellinger said.

The walk will begin at Central United Methodist Church, 113 S. Piedmont Avenue, at 2 p.m. Following a kickoff pep rally, the walk will proceed throughout the

city with rest stops and refreshments, police escorts, safe crossings at major intersections, a shuttle for tired walkers and fellowship with others who share the same concern "to help those less fortunate than us."

This year, the CROP Walk is being expanded beyond church congregations to businesses, industries and civic clubs in the greater Kings Mountain area.

"We ask that business and industry and civic leaders choose someone within their firm or organization to be designated as a recruiter," Dellinger said. "This person will seek individuals to get pledges and walk as a team to represent their firm or organization. It is hoped that the business or industry will match totals that area raised by employees, or if possible, maybe even offer corporate level sponsorship for walkers." Businesses and clubs that are not

able to sponsor walkers are urged to give grants or pledges.

Dellinger said a meeting of recruiters will be held September 27 at 4 p.m. at St. Matthew's Lutheran Church, 201 N. Piedmont Avenue. Information and packets will be handed out at this time and a speaker from Raleigh will brief the group on CROP Walk.

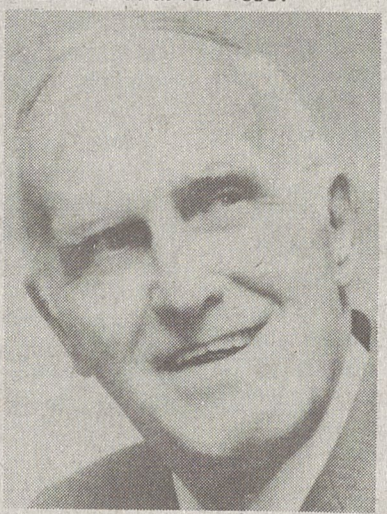

Rev. Daniel McCaskill, Rector at Trinity since 1988, invites visitors to join the congregation in the special service.

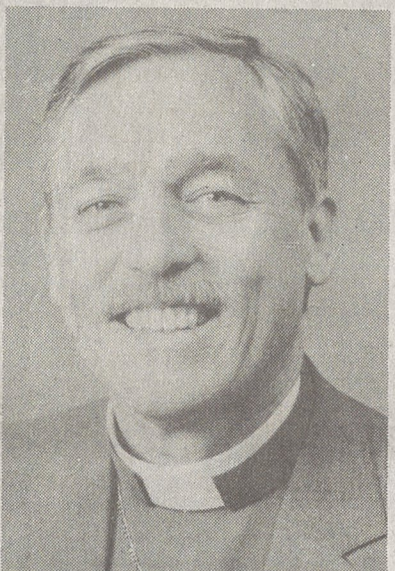
Eastside Baptist Church will hold Homecoming Day Sunday with special song services and dinner on the grounds.
