Stewart and Austin had to stay in town, 'cause there was work to be done. But, they've both laid low. They've been seen ducking out the back door several times.


once lived in Moss Lake, led the pickers with a 9-7 record. He said he knew Stewart and Austin were no competition, 'cause he's seen them play golf before.


Kings Mountain Middle School's girls softball team won three games during the past week to run its Bi-County Conference record to 5-4.
