"Being a technologist in this field involves much more than pushing buttons on equipment," she says. "Because the field of radiology is so high-tech and ever changing, there is a lot of schooling involved, as well as, certification and licensing which is required. New developments are constantly taking place such as CAT scanning, nuclear medicine, ultrasound imaging, MRI and other such procedures. We want the community to be aware of value of

these diagnostic tools and the precision involved in applying them correctly."

Community awareness and education is also an important aspect of diagnosing many illnesses. The staff of technicians in the Department of Radiology is committed to informing their community about the role of radiology in early diagnosis. Recently, one of the technologists led a workshop on breast cancer at a local church, stressing the importance of self-participation in one's health care.
