# Student

If you are a committed, consistent, and caring adult who is interested in becoming a mentor for a student in the middle school, Kings Mountain Schools have developed a new program which may be of interest to you.

The KM Mentor Program has been developed to provide supportive, one-on-one relationships for students in the middle school who have problems with attendance, discipline and classroom achievement. The goal of the program is to increase the students' ability to function in school and in society in a constructive way.

In order to become a mentor, a person must meet the following requirements:

1 - Submit an application to the KM Mentor Program by January 22, 1993.

2 - Participate in a screening process including an interview and a check for criminal offenses.

3 - Participate in a four hour training program and any required in-service training scheduled during the year.

4 - Make a commitment to spend at least one period per week with your student for the entire school year.

Applications for this program will be available in the office of Kings Mountain Middle School on January 5 and need to be returned to the KM Mentor Program no later than January 22.
