# This is the tax season

January when millions of tax forms are mailed by the Internal Revenue Service.

If you were one of the three million taxpayers in North Carolina who filed a federal income tax return last year, then you can expect to receive a tax package from the IRS within a few days.

J. R. Starkey, district director of the IRS, said the IRS expects that more taxpayers will be able to file a shorter form again this year. The Form 1040A can again be used to file pension or annuity income, IRA distributions, taxable social security benefits or estimated tax payments, rather than having to use the longer Form 1040.

Taxpayers who choose to file their income tax return electronically can expect to receive their refund much faster than if they mail their tax return to the IRS, he said. Taxpayers can have their refund deposited to their checking account, savings account,

Tax season begins in early or mailed to their home if they file electronically.

If you don't receive a tax package, forms may be ordered by calling toll free 1-800-829-3676, Monday through Friday, 8 a.m.-4:45 p.m. Forms can also be ordered on Saturdays beginning January 2 through April 10, 1993, from 9 a.m.-3 p.m.

April 15 is the deadline to file a return.


