KMHS student suspended following drug incident

A Kings Mountain High School 9th grader has been suspended from school for 10 days after he reportedly took a bag of Crack Cocaine to school.

Officers with the Kings Mountain Police Department said the offense is a felony possession of a controlled substance.

Principal Jackie Lavender said the youth could get his suspension reduced if he takes a drug prevention program through CODAP.

Officers said the youth claimed the bag of Crack in his possession belonged to another student. "The boy claimed he was holding the controlled substance for another student," according to the report filed January 21.
