

This is Scout Week in Kings Mountain

Scouting is a family affair for City Councilman Al Moretz and his two sons, Jeremy, 25, and Jimmy, 15.

A Life Scout in Troop 91 of which his father is Scoutmaster, Jimmy, a 10th grader at Kings Mountain High School, went to Philmont Scout Ranch in Cimarron, NM last summer and this summer plans to attend Scouting's big National Jamboree with his father at Fort A. P. Hill in Virginia.

The whole family, including Mrs. Moretz and daughter, Kimberly, 23, back the men in their Scouting ventures and most times the activities out of town and in town are family affairs.

This week is Boy Scout Week and some 100 Boy Scouts in three troops opened activities with Boy Scout Sunday. Last weekend the Moretz family accompanied Troop 91 on a skiing trip. Thursday night local leaders will attend a recognition banquet at Shelby's Ascension Lutheran Church.

"We're always looking for young men to join our troops," said Moretz, who became Troop 91 leader two years ago. The 68-year-old troop received its charter from England and is the oldest in the Battleground District and among the oldest continuing troops in the Piedmont Boy Scout Council.

Former Scoutmasters have included Otis Falls Jr. who served 15 years and holds Scouting's highest rank, the Silver Beaver; Wallace Stalls and Tommy King, who also served 15 years and is now serving as Battleground District Commissioner and puts on Scout shows in the district. Eagle Scout Jeremy Moretz earned his badge under the leadership of Falls.

Sons and grandsons of St. Matthew's Lutheran Church members have been members of Troop 91. At one time the troop was among the largest in the area with a membership of over 100 boys. City Commissioner Fred Finger was an Eagle Scout in Troop 91.

"Youth who become active in Scouts stay for life," said Moretz, who recognized eight Scouts with merit badges and saw Jacob Moschler and Preston Baxter advance to second class and Jacob Moschler, Joey Gray and Brian Cannon advance to first class ranks at Monday night's Court of Honor. He also recognized Assistant Scoutmasters Jack Moschler, Bill Gray and Erin Baxter and parents, including Larry and Cindy Cannon, David Sanders, Libby Walters, Jimmy Mauney, Scot Noblitt, Judy Gray and Cathy Moretz.

Officers of Troop 91 are Jeremy Moretz, senior patrol leader; Joey Gray, assistant patrol leader; Jacob Moschler, troop guide; Buzzy Walter, troop quartermaster; Philip Leonhart, historian; Preston Baxter, librarian; Brian Cannon, Brad Philbeck, Alex Mauney, patrol leaders; Buzzy Walters, Charlie Mauney and Jonathan Sanders, assistant patrol leaders.

Moretz will lead his 17 Scouts to a summer adventure at Camp Bud Schieffele in Rutherford County and his three First Class Scouts Gray, Cannon and Moschler to junior leadership training conference.

Moretz said he started training as a Scout as a youngster. When his sons became interested in Scouts the whole family's activity increased.

And his family has extended to include many new Scouters and Scouters he and his wife have met during their travels with the Scouts.

Some 40-50 boys are active in Troop 92 sponsored by First Baptist Church and led by Jim Ferebee, Scoutmaster, and Beth Brock, Cub Master and 20 Scouts are active in Bethware Troop 94 and Pack 95 led by David Evans, Scoutmaster.

Miller attends meeting

Shearra Miller, a member of the Kings Mountain Board of Education, joined more than 600 public school board members in Washington, DC on January 24-26 to discuss current public school issues and to meet with their federal representatives regarding legislation affecting public education.

The forum was the 20th annual meeting of the National School Boards Association's Federal Relations Network.

"The new administration, as well as the many new faces in the Congress, offer unique opportuni-

ties for local school districts to advocate for public school children concerns," said Miller. "The successful future of this nation's public educational system is closely tied to the need for partnerships between the federal, state and local levels, and the activities of the Congress, as well as the new administration, are key to initiating such a coalition."

The participating school board members received messages from Representatives Robert Andrews (D-NJ) and Newt Gingrich (R-GA) on critical issues in education fac-

ing the 103rd Congress. Additionally, political analyst Charles Cook discussed implications for education given the structure and agenda of the new administration. Congressional awards were presented to Senators Robert Byrd (D-WV), Jim Sasser, D-TN) and Howard Metzenbaum (D-OH), and Representatives William D. Ford (D-MI) and John Conyers (D-MI) for their leadership and support of public education.

The meeting concluded with school board members visiting their Congressional representatives on Capitol Hill to present NSBA's legislative agenda for the 103rd Congress.
