Lifeguard training is the most current Red Cross certification course for those interested in waterfront employment for the summer and is the only certification many pools will acknowledge as a qualification for employment.

Participants must be at least 15 years of age by May 25, a competent swimmer and diver and have of the course. An additional six to eight hours is required to complete the new Red Cross Standard First Aid course before the Lifeguard certificate is issued.
