Lifeguard training class to begin

Bell to play baseball at G-W

The Kings Mountain Parks and Recreation Department is conducting a lifeguard training class at Neisler Natatorium August 2-13 from 9 a.m.-12 noon Monday through Friday.

All participants must show current certification in ARC Standard First-Aid and ARC CPR, or equiv-

Lifeguard training is the most current Red Cross certification course for those interested in waterfront employment for the summer and is the only certification many pools will acknowledge as a qualification for employment.

Participants must be at least 15 years of age by May 25, 1993, a competent swimmer and diver, and have the ability to tread water for one minute. The suggested course length is 27 contact hours for the water and the book work portions of the course. An additional 6 to 8 hours is required to complete the new Red Cross Standard First Aid Course before the lifeguard certificate is issued.
