Sylvia Neisler finished second with a 170 and Kimberly McGinnis was third with 174.



"A lot of guys I played with or against were there, including Bill Wright, Henry Kimbrell, Buck Leonard, Monty Irvin, Leon Day, Andrew Porter, and others, and Josh Gibson's son was there," Robinson noted. "They had an oldtimers game the night before the all-star game but we didn't participate in it. People like Reggie Jackson, Lou Brock, Bob Feller and Bob Gibson played. I saw Yogi Berra, Boog Powell, Frank Robinson and Brooks Robinson, and the master of ceremonies was Joe Garagiola."

After the all-star introductions, Robinson said he went to his place in the stands and signed autographs for fans for a while, then left early for the hotel.

"I was kind of under the weather the whole time," he noted. "I was playing golf a couple of weeks before the all-star game and my hip started bothering me and I've been under the doctor's care ever since.

"All of the festivities surrounding all-star week were exciting, but it was a pretty rough schedule," he said. "But I saw guys I hadn't seen in 35 or 40 years and that was

The Orioles had uniforms, caps and baseball shoes made for all of the Negro League legends who attended the festivities, and that meant a lot, Robinson said.

Robinson said it's also good to see baseball finally recognize the Negro League stars, and he hopes someday to see those players included in the major league pension plan. Several people are working on that idea now and the Upper Deck company, which publishes baseball cards and markets other memorabilia, is marketing sweat shirts, jackets and caps of the Kansas City Monarchs of which the players receive a royalty.

"I have the jacket and cap," Robinson said, "and they're nice. They say they can't keep them on hand, they sell so fast.'

Robinson caught Satchel Paige while he played with the Monarchs and Satchel Paige All-Stars, and they became best friends. Paige nicknamed Robinson "Slow" because of his slow Alabama accent.

Robinson also played with the Chicago American Giants before moving to the Canadian League when the Negro League went under in the early fifties. He was offered a major league contract but turned it down because of his age
