King and his wife, Ruth Ware King, lived in Sylva briefly after he took early retirement in 1981. King worked for Southern Bell 33 years in the network department. They moved to Grover in 1988 where they joined Grover First Baptist Church and King became active in Grover Lions Club and town government. He was a World War II Navy veteran. His hobby was fishing with longtime friend Ken Jenkins, camping with his family and music.

King served from 1989-91 as a Grover town commissioner and led the effort to get the first sanitation truck for the town. During his tenure the addition to city hall was built. King ran for mayor but lost the election to Mayor Ronald Queen two years ago.

King suffered a brain hemor-

rhage and a stroke April 19.
