JVs blank Mooresville

Kings Mountain High's junior varsity football team ran its record to 4-0 Thursday night with a 13-0 victory over Mooresville at KM's John Gamble Stadium.

The Mountaineers open Southwestern 3-A Conference play Thursday at 7 p.m. at R-S Central.

Fullback Shane Logan, who rushed for 109 yards in 26 carries, scored both KM touchdowns last week. He scored on a one-yard run in the second quarter to give the Mountaineers a 6-0 halftime lead, and scored on a four-yard run in

the third quarter. Justin Champion kicked the point-after to account for the final margin.

Tailback Desmond Holland also had a big night offensively for the Mountaineers with 98 yards in 11 carries. Marcus Smith came up with a key pass interception late in the game to preserve the shutout.

"One of the most enjoyable things about coaching is watching you men get better at playing football," said KM Coach Denny Hicks. "We were struggling at 6-0 late in the game but Desmond

Holland picked things up a notch, and along with good blocking by the offensive line made the difference in the ball game."

Mark Johnson had a good game on the offensive line and did an exceptional job of blocking on the off-tackle plays, Hicks said.

The coaching staff cited Robert Love, Jason Wade and Smith for their defensive play, and Champion for his play on special teams. He got off several key punts to keep Mooresville backed up on its own side of the field most of the game.

The Kings Mountain Wildcats improved their record to a perfect 4-0 with a 9-2 win over the Lincolnton Optimist team Saturday.

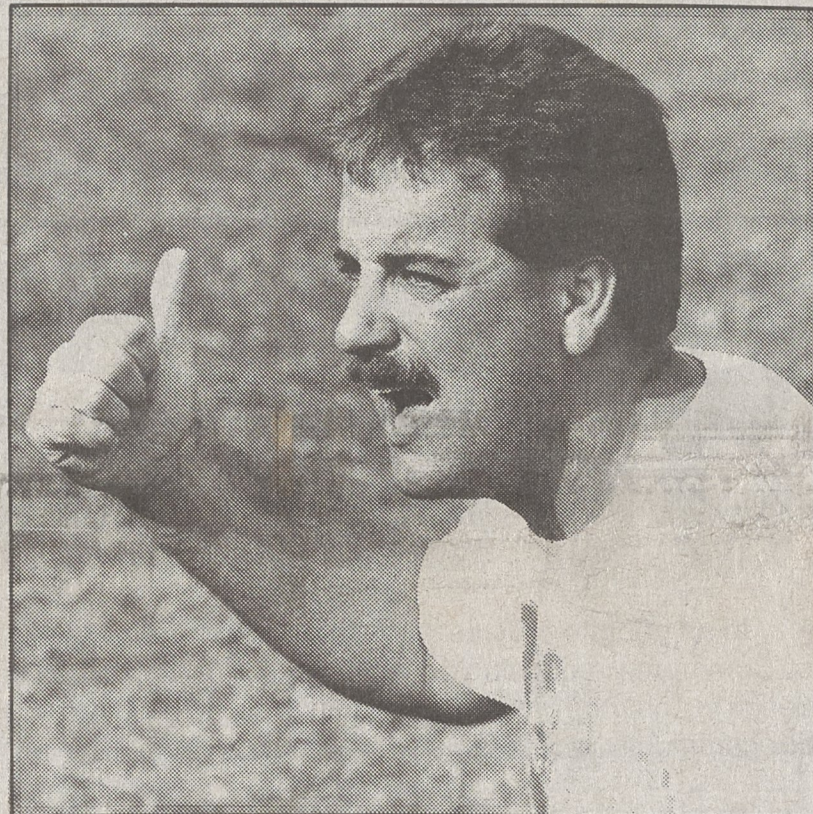
The Wildcats hold down first place in the Lincolnton Fall Baseball League.

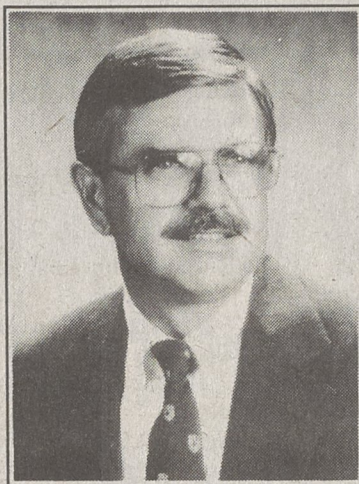

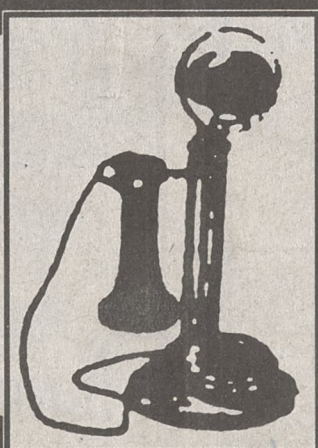
