Ornaments were displayed on a tree in the school office during the first two weeks of December.

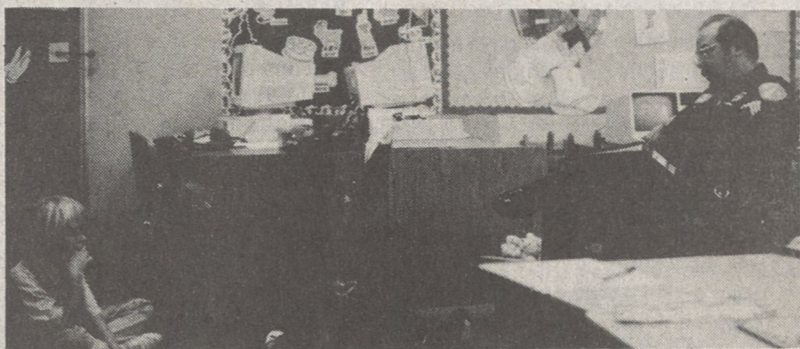
