As would-be rivals drop out, Republican David Balmer, 31, of Charlotte, continues to aggressively pursue the 9th District U. S. House seat being vacated by Congressman Alex McMillan.

Balmer was lining up support in Kings Mountain Friday, as he met with local GOP leaders. The 9th District also includes Kings Mountain in Cleveland County.

To a finance committee already top-heavy with big-name business leaders, Balmer also added Ray McKenney of McKenney Chevrolet of Kings Mountain, John Fraley Jr. of Carolina Freight in Cherryville and Duke Kimbrell of Parkdale Mills.

Kings Mountain Mayor Scott Neisler and Ole Country Store proprietor Rick Moore gave Balmer and N. C. Senate candidate Dennis Davis a tour of the business district New Year's Eve and they all had lunch with supporters at Fred Kiser's Grill.

House Minority Leader Balmer was first elected at age 26 to the North Carolina House from District 55. In 1993 he sponsored many bills including the first-ever House Republican Caucus state budget proposal.

"We wanted our budget to be a side-by-side, apples-to-apples comparison," Balmer said.

The budget plan, which Balmer printed at his own expense, even includes a provision calling for line-item veto for the governor, an issue Republicans pushed hard during Martin's two terms. The budget argues that many of the functions of agencies duplicate efforts of private groups and that the state should save the money it puts into them. The GOP wants to cut spending to the North Carolina Arts Council, the Council on the Status of Women, the Microelectronics Center, the Wanchese Seafood Industrial Park and other agencies that have been GOP targets before.

The House Republican caucus has long been in favor of veto power for the governor," Balmer said. We will even support giving it to Governor Hunt.'

Balmer says he hopes that the Democratic leadership of the General Assembly will give the GOP budget proposals a serious

"With 42 Republicans in the House this year we are a more potent block of votes and it's time we stood up and said what we believed in," said Balmer. "We are a mature opposition party in the legislature."

Balmer's budget, which he said he prepared on his own home computer and paid the \$1,500 printing costs from personal funds, would eliminate the state tax on food, extend child care tax credits to families who care for their preschool children at home and cut more than 3,400 state jobs.

Born and raised in Charlotte, Balmer is a graduate of UNC at Chapel Hill and Wake Forest University Law School, graduating by telephone. in the top 20 percent of his class.

He won the 1989 Legislator of the Year Award from the Police Benevolent Association, the 1990 and 1992 Guardian of Small Business Awards from the National Federation of Small Independent Businesses and the 1991 N. C. Taxpayers United perfect score, the 1993 N. C. Free Pro-Business group award, ranking six out of 120 representatives.
