## Realtors support disclosure bill

Kings Mountain Association of Realtors passed a resolution recently urging passage of N.C. House Bill 1032, "Residential Property Condition Disclosure."

President Bob Maner said that Secretary Linda Newsome has mailed copies of the resolution to local legislators, including Senator J. Ollie Harris of Kings Mountain, and House members Edith Lutz of Polkville, John Weatherly of Kings Mountain and Dr. Jack Hunt of

Lattimore.

"We believe the passage of the bill is in the public interest," said Maner.

The proposed legislation would require that sellers of residential real property, of one to four units, must disclose to prospective buyers those property conditions that are not easily observable which may adversely affect the value of the property.
