known as a grandfather clause. Two matters concerning property uses were tabled at Monday's

board meeting Businessman Tommy Keeter wants to put up 30 mobile homes on his property beside of Grover Cemetery and develop them 10 at a time. He requested water and sewer from the town. Councilman Jack Herndon suggested that Queen contact an engineer to look at the property before the board makes a decision.

Another citizen wants to put up a trailer on Chestnut Street. No present ordinance prohibits it but City Attorney Mickey Corry suggested that the woman place the request on the agenda for the next board meeting. Corry said the board could legally issue a moratorium until the zoning map is approved but no action was taken. Queen said the woman wants a trailer permit and a sewer tap.

Rollins said the new zoning ordinances may have an effect on both the Keeter proposal and the mobile home request He said that the new ordinance calls for a buffer between the cemetery and other lots and that the trailers would have to sit 50 feet from the property line. He suggested that the board take a look at the ordinance as it

affected the new requests. Rollins said that what appears to be a junk yard with junked vehicles is going up on Highway 226 and is inconsistent with the proposed new zoning. Councilman Robbie Sides said that some trailers and as many as 10 junked cars are currently on the lot. He said an ordinance is already on the books that prohibits junked vehicles.

Rollins said the zoning recommendations were based on land use trends in the various areas of town and what the zoning board felt would be a logical growth pattern.

"I don't think there will be much opposition to the zoning map because land can be used as it is being used now," said Rollins. "Any time you begin to regulate construction there will be some objection because people see it as a restriction rather than a protection. Right now anybody can do anything anywhere in Grover.'
