A native of Gaston County, she was the daughter of the late William A. and Hannah White Robinson.

She was a graduate of Flora McDonald College in Red Springs and Presbyterian School of Christian Education in Richmond, Va. and completed graduate study at Bible Seminary in New York, at Duke University and at the University of North Carolina.

St. Andrew's Presbyterian College at Laurinburg named her Christian Educator of the Year. She was the first woman deacon at Long Creek Presbyterian Church and served as president of the Women of the Church and also as a former Sunday School teacher. She had been a member of the Long Creek Presbyterian Church for many years.

Miss Robinson, widely respected lay leader in the Presbyterian Church USA, had not confined her service to Oklahoma Presbyterian College. Evidence of her fellow citizens' regard for her came in 1960 when she was named Woman of the Year by the Business and

Professional Women's Clubs. Prior to her graduate study she taught high school Mathematics and Science. A later assignment was teaching five years at the Golden Castle College for Girls in Japan. When strained relations between the United States and Japan prevented a longer tour of duty, she taught Bible at Highland Institute

in Kentucky before moving to Durant, Oklahoma.

When asked about the inevitable problems connected with her type of work, Miss Robinson admitted there had been frustrations.

"But the satisfactions so far outweigh the problems that they seem almost negligible," she said.

For a time financial problems were serious at the college but the school's money problems soon cleared up. Another difficulty was getting staff members in the early

One important area of expansion is connected with OPC's role as international center which has been known throughout the world.

But it was not only the service to foreign students which Miss Robinson recalled with satisfaction. American Indian students have been served through the

Robinson said in an interview after her retirement that many students came with language handicaps and with almost complete lack of confidence.

"For so many boys and girls," she explained, "OPC has been the only possible opportunity for edu-
