to get on Senate ballot

Retired Casar resident and decorated Army veteran Jack Bass needs signatures of 3,000 registered voters so that he can run for the 37th N. C. Senate in November as an Unaffiliated candidate.

Bass started circulating his petition in the Kings Mountain area this week.

Bass wants on the ballot to win. He says he is a people, not a Party person.

Although this is his first time to run for public office, Bass says he has been involved with the workings of government all his life. He is a former member of the Republican State Executive Committee.

"When only 14 Senators show up to vote during the Governor's special crime session in Raleigh it's time to do something," said Bass of his decision to throw his hat in the ring with a big field of candidates for the seat that J. Ollie Harris of Kings Mountain is vacating in November.

An Army veteran of the Korean Conflict, Bass is well known to veterans organizations and has been a leader in helping disabled veterans and their widows receive benefits.

"I got out of the Democrat and Republican Parties because they haven't shown the veterans and disabled veterans who applied for social security any help at all," said

went into the Army just out of high school and on his 18th birthday participated in the Inchon Invasion with the 7th Infantry Division. He was wounded in the Liberation of Seoul while crossing Han River on the way to the 38th Parallel and sent back to the states to recuper-

As a drill sergeant he led basic training at Fort Sill, Oklahoma. He returned to Korea with the 8th Cavalry for his second tour of duty.

He received the Korean Service Medal, the United Nations Medal and the Purple Heart with Star and was nominated for the Silver Star but was discharged before the paper work was completed. He helped train the first Republic of Korea Army.

Bass retired from Jack's Factory Outlets after opening a number of clothing stores

Bass said he has worked in numerous jobs, from picking and chopping cotton after school to operating grills, working for Belk Stores, and owning his own businesses. He owned the Shelby Rebel Baseball team in 1965 and Toronto Blue Jays Coach Gene Tennis was one of the first stars of his team.

"I thought when I served my country that I would be allowed to get my name on the ballot without so much trouble," said Bass.

The 38th Senatorial District includes Cleveland and Rutherford Counties. Bass is circulating petitions in both counties.




