Little leagues need sponsors

Kings Mountain Parks and Recreation Department is asking local businesses and industries to sponsor girls and boys baseball and softball teams this season.

Because the department receives no money to sponsor teams it must raise \$35,700 to outfit all the teams and purchase necessary equipment and pay umpires.

Over \$20,000 has been raised thus far, but the department is far short of its needs as the season rapidly approaches. Recreation Director Bruce Clark said other teams must have sponsors within the next two weeks.

Clark said approximately \$850 is needed to sponsor and outfit a team. After the initial year sponsorship costs will decrease to about \$250 to \$300 because uniforms will not have to be purchased every

"I don't understand what has happened in the past, but it really doesn't concern me," he said. "What I'm concerned about is that we get good sponsors and have them feel good about us being responsible for their equipment and uniforms in the future so that once the initial fee is over the yearly sponsorship cost will decrease.

"I think this is a great service that businesses can provide for young people and it serves as a great advertising tool for their companies.

Clark said many businesses are sponsoring both boys and girls teams this year, which results in about \$1,500 of support. "It's very much appreciated and it would certainly be nice if others would consider helping these young boys and girls with recreation activities for the summer."
