WINS DEGREE — Mrs. John H. Gamble has completed requirements for her master of arts degree in home economics from Winthrop college.

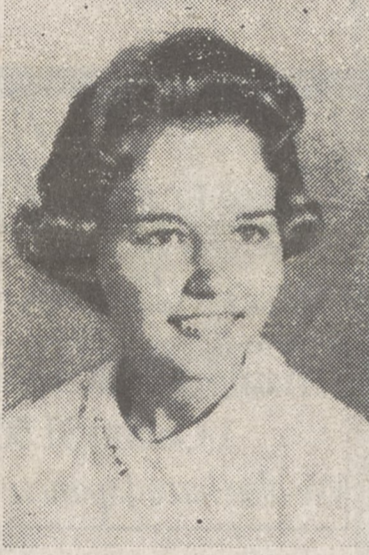

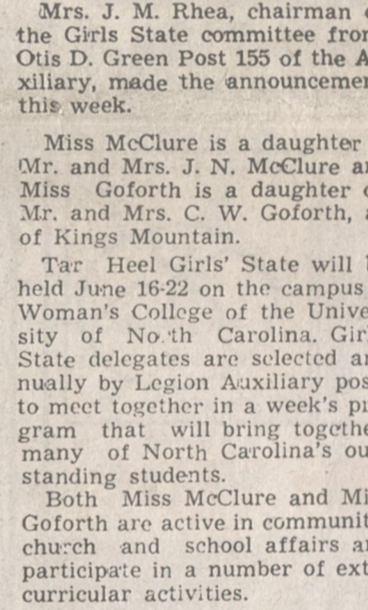
