A bill which would put a cap on the future growth of state government spending will be introduced in the N. C. State Legislature by Rep. Billy Joye of Belmont

"Between 1972 and 1993, spending in the N.C. General Fund grew from roughly \$1 billion to \$9.2 billion," said North Carolina Taxpayers United advisory board member Johnathan Rhyne of Lincolnton.

"Because of our past spending habits, we now have the second highest state taxes in the Southeast. Only Kentucky has higher state taxes," he said.
