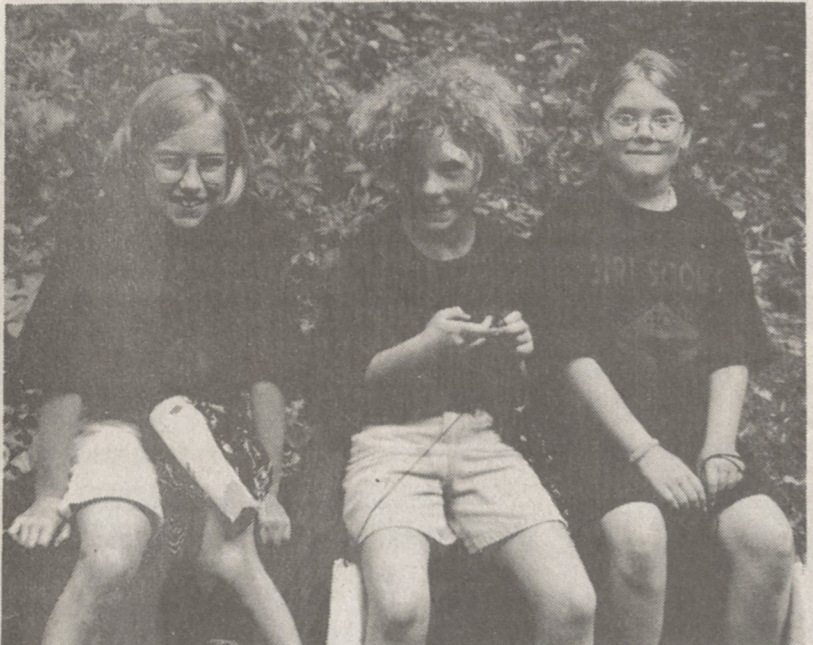
Proceeds from the concert will benefit the Dr. Stan Hardin Memorial Scholarship Fund at the College.

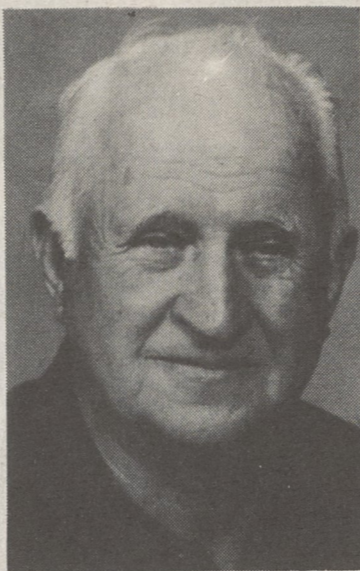
An Easter Box Turtle program will be held Sunday at 2 p.m. at the park office. Live turtles will be used. The program will last 45 minutes.

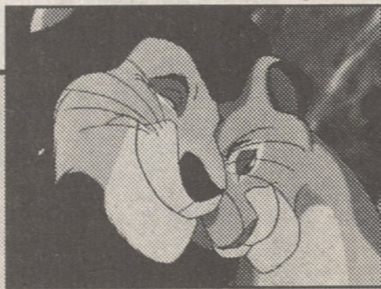
The annual dinner meeting of the Council on Aging will be held at the Senior Center on Tuesday, June 14. The Dutch dinner is \$6.
