

Free health screenings

A child health carnival featuring free health screenings for children ages birth to five years old will be held at Bethware School next week.

The Cleveland County Head Start program will give health checks for vision, hearing, speech, language, height, weight, dental and blood pressure Monday from 9 a.m.-2 p.m., Tuesday from 5-7 p.m., Wednesday, July 20, from 9 a.m.-2 p.m., Thursday, July 21, from 9 a.m.-2 p.m. and Friday, July 22, from 9 a.m.-2 p.m.

"It's a good opportunity for parents to have their children screened before they apply for Head Start or other preschool programs," said Patti Norman, Director of Head Start.

The Crime Prevention Office of Gardner-Webb University will be making Operation Care identification bracelets at Monday's screening at Gardner-Webb. The cost will be \$5 for two bracelets.

Screenings are also planned at Gardner-Webb University in Boiling Springs on Monday from 9 a.m.-2 p.m., at Number Three School on Davis Road in Shelby on July 21 from 5-7 p.m., at the County Office Building on South Post Road in Shelby on July 23 from 9 a.m.-2 p.m. and at Cleveland Community College on July 30 from 9 a.m.-2 p.m.

Area professionals from the Cleveland County Health Department, Cleveland Center and the Development Evaluation Center will assist representatives of all three school systems at the health carnival.

In other matters Thursday night, the Board:

- Heard a presentation by parent Tom Sees on parent involvement, the Family Life curriculum, and other matters. Sees insisted - and the Board and McRae agreed - that night-time meetings are needed when Family Life curriculum is reviewed. McRae said if there is not sufficient time to schedule meetings shortly after the start of school, Family Life classes will be delayed.

- Awarded milk and bread bids for the 1994-95 school year.

- Approved numerous employee contracts and student transfers.

- Approved a number of budget amendments necessary to balance

the 1993-94 fiscal year budget; and approved an interim 1994-95 budget of \$16,538,821. Since the system has not received official word of some of its state allocations, McRae said it may be September before the official budget is adopted.

- Held an executive session to discuss concerns of Danny and Melany Bolin, but no action was reported.

- Was told by McRae that action on Kings Mountain, Shelby and Cleveland County's request for a grant to fund an alternative school has been postponed until the August meeting of the State Board of Education. McRae said he is hopeful that the units will receive at least \$360,000.

- Announced that the August Board meeting will be on Thursday, Aug. 4 at 7 p.m. at the Superintendent's office.

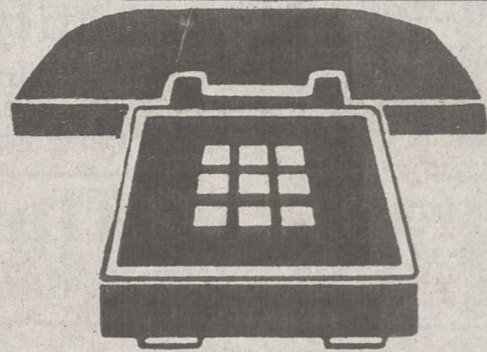

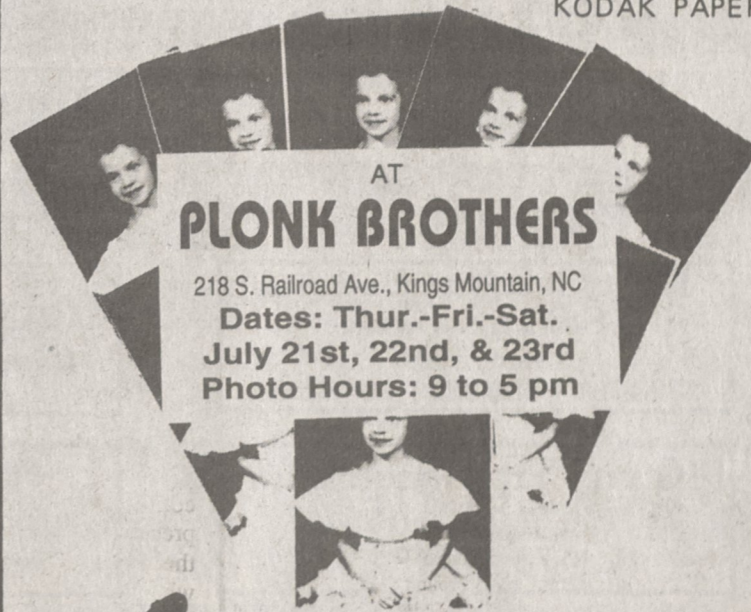
