Shooting accident fatal to BC teen

A Bessemer City teen-ager is dead after what Cleveland County police said was a shooting accident Tuesday at 178 E.A. Bingham Road near Kings Mountain.

Sammy Craig Campbell Jr., 13, of 132 Coho Road, Bessemer City, reportedly was camping out with friends. One of the boys reportedly took a .38 calibre revolver from his mother's car and found that it was cocked. According to the boy's statement on a Charlotte TV station, he was uncocking it when it discharged and struck Campbell in the head.

The incident reportedly occurred at 1:35 a.m. Campbell was taken to Cleveland Memorial Hospital where he died at 2:45 a.m.

Teens face charges


