The October meeting will be at the home of Carolyn Cobb.

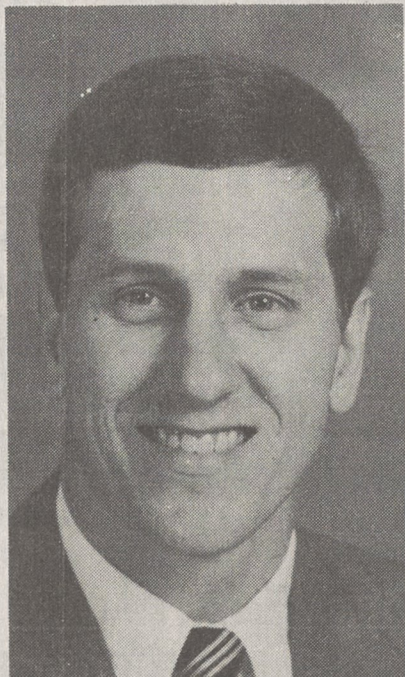
Steve Southwell is promoted by Rock Hill National Bank
