New fiction at Mauney Memorial Library:

Jekel, Pamela. "Deepwater: A Novel of the Carolinas" (Kensington Books, 1994).

This is the story of Tess Hancock, whose family carves out a fragile future in an untamed wilderness. It is a cruel trick of fate that makes practical Tess, not her pretty, wilful sister, the bride of Jack Dobbs, a dashing ex-privateer.

Just, Worth. "Ambition and Love" (Houghton Mifflin Company, 1994).

This is a book about varieties of desire. Its heroine is a painter, Georgia Whyte, an American who has fled the turbulence of Los Angeles and Chicago for the anonymity of Europe. In Paris, she succeeds in living by her heart, expecting there will be a price to pay and wondering what that price will be.

Kagan, Elaine. "The Girls" (Alfred A. Knopf, 1994).

As intensely American as a senior prom, this is a big, crowded novel about six women, best friends since high school, now in their forties and still girls. They've been close to each other forever. Is there anything they don't know about each other?

Katz, Molly. "Nobody Believes Me" (Ballantine Books, 1994).

Every woman longs for him. The perfect man. The perfect lover. But once you've found him, will you also discover he is not what he seems? Even if Lynn Marchette hadn't been looking for love, he would be hard to resist. And Lynn doesn't. But when she get a life-threatening letter from Greg, written in her own hand, no one believes her. In this deftly crated novel of psychological suspense, Katz spins a gripping tale of a woman's chilling realization that in welcoming the man of her dreams into her heart, she may have embraced a nightmare.

Keegan, John E. "Clearwater Summer" (Carroll & Graff Publishers, Inc., 1994).

Keegan's enchanting novel tells the wonderfully observed story of a 14-year-old boy confronting the deadly adult realization of an idyllic small town in the Pacific Northwest.

King, Thomas. "Green Grass, Running Water" (Houghton Mifflin Company, 1993).

This is the story of five Blackfoot Indians in the town of Blossen and its nearby reserve where very different lives nevertheless continually cross. This is a rich tale, weaving subtle, magical humor, revisionist history, muted

nostalgic, and sacred humanity into one bright, whole cloth.

Kingsolver, Barbara. "Pigs in Heaven" (Harper Collins Publishers, 1993).

When six-year-old Turtle Greer witnesses a freak accident at the Hoover Dam, her insistence on what she has seen and her mother's belief in her lead to a man's dramatic rescue. But Turtle's moment of celebrity draws her into a conflict of historic proportions.

Krantz, Judith. "Lovers" (Crown Publishers, Inc., 1994).

Richly detailed and intricate in plot, this novel is bursting with captivating characters, many of them new, and many favorites from previous novels. Together they form a group of a half dozen couples engaged in an intoxicating, interwoven dance of love.

Krist, Gary. "Bone by Bone" (Harcourt Brace & Company, 1994).

The author takes his characters from the broad spectrum of middle class America. But while his humor thrives, his canvas now has darker, deeper tones as he explores the solitude of misfits, the pain of separation, and the uneasiness of everyday relationships.

Lifecourt, Peter. "Di and I" (Random House, 1994).

Princess Di's in love. At last. After all the fuss about Charles and Camilla, the cellular phone tapes, the sweaty workout photos, Di's finally found the right guy - Leonard Schecter, an American commoner with a taste for long-legged blondes and epic poetry.

Llywelyn, Morgan. "Finn MacCool" (Forge, 1994).

Llywelyn has enthralled readers with magnificent tales of her native land. Now she has recreated Ireland's most amazing man in a novel of sweeping historical grandeur and awesome adventure.

Lowry, Beverly. "The Track of Real Desires" (Alfred A. Knopf, 1994).

Leland Standard left Eunola, Mississippi as soon as she could, pursuing dreams of dancing, culture, and a wider world. Now, 35 years later, she is coming home, bringing with her a son, Toby, who is older now than she was when she left, as well as an ailment that

might change her life all over again.

Mapson, Jo-Ann. "Blue Rodeo" (Harper Collins Publishers, 1994).

What has begun as an act of rebellion for sensible Margaret, abandoning her California life for the small town of Blue Dog, New Mexico, turns into much more than a year's retreat. Amidst bright yellow summer wild flowers and fascination of meeting master weaver Verbena Youngcloud, Maggie locates the courage to pick up more than her old paint brushes. She falls in love.

Menchery, Joanne. "Home and Away" (Simon & Schuster, 1994).

Hedy is a straddler by nature, and at the moment she is doing a balancing act on all fronts. This is contemporary fiction at its most moving - funny, earth, arrogant, and true.

Michaels, Barbara. "Houses of Stone" (Simon & Schuster, 1993).

When young professor of English, Karen Holloway, happens on a privately printed volume of verse dating from the early 19th century, it's all in a day's work. But when a battered manuscript bearing the same mysterious attribution "Ismene," turns up, Karen realizes that it is an important discovery that could be the making of her academic career.

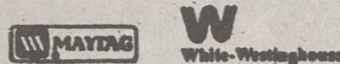

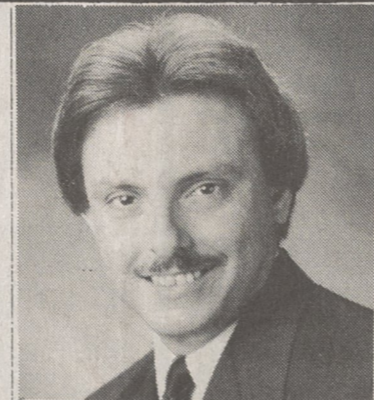
