for a town this size. Everybody's fighting one another," said Spivey.

City Attorney Mickey Corry said the board has the authority to cut uncut lots and place a tax lien on the properties.

Councilmen took no vote on the matter.

Councilman Jack Herndon suggested that a local wrecker service be contacted first before Town Board gives the wrecker business to a service in Kings Mountain. A wrecker service and storage area are required before the town can enforce a junk car ordinance.

Mayor Ronald Queen said that the contractor is ready to paint the Grover water tank inside and out. He said water lines will soon be run to Timberline and Springdale Roads at cost of \$2700. He also reported that 27 new Christmas lights fixtures are on hand and that a 12 feet tall Christmas tree will be ordered in November and go up

downtown during the Christmas season.

Saltz suggested that money for Christmas lights be used instead for a policeman's salary.

Saltz and Spivey clashed about spending the money for Christmas lights.

"You were the first one who wanted lights in town," said Spivey.

"I wanted to light up the streets so we could see outside our businesses," said Saltz.

Queen said that no one in Grover is disputing the need for a part time police officer.

church services at First Baptist Church where Mr. McGill is a life-long member and Mrs. McGill joined on her wedding day.

Daughter of the late Thomas Homer and Ioma Brooks Grant of Dekalb County, Ga., Edna was born January 4, 1905. She met her husband at First Baptist Church in Kings Mountain and they courted two years before he popped the question.

"I told Isaac I planned to leave Kings Mountain and spend the summer in Georgia with my folks and he said he wanted to go with me as my husband," she recalled.

McGill is the son of the late Isaac Alexander and Mary Amanda Fulton McGill and was reared in a family of six brothers and six sisters. One sister and two brothers survive.

Mrs. McGill, raised in a family of two brothers and two sisters, has one surviving sister, Mary Gibson, 86, of Carrollton, Ga., who visits her regularly and they compare recipes and put up squash, tomatoes, pears, and watermelon rind pickles.

She recalled that as a young girl she met wives of World War I soldiers who stayed in their boarding house in Georgia. The soldiers on leave visited their wives at their residence.


Edna has her own car and does her own grocery shopping and cooking. Mr. McGill, who has been homebound for three years, rides with his wife to town on occasion. Their extended family includes two nursing assistants, Joy Bowen and Traci Doster.

"I've always been a farm girl," exclaimed Edna, recalling the time she killed a snake with a hoe in the yard of their country home.

Although the McGills do little farming now, Edna still freezes and cans vegetables and is recognized as one of the best cooks in the city. Her cabbage casserole is a favorite of family night suppers and circle meetings at her church.

Since Isaac's illness, the family has missed their regular church attendance but they enjoy the taped services.

And occasionally, Edna takes down her hat boxes and models the frilly hats she designed "back in the good ole days."
