Local people starting making donations at Plonk's General Store months before the child died of neuroblastoma.



"You just live every day to the fullest and don't worry about tomorrow," said Sharon, who is now the mother of a handsome little boy, D. J., seven months.


During the last months of their daughter's life, Sharon and her husband spent every minute with her and at her death bed they said they saw Winter reach her hands upward towards heaven.
