couldn't get Bryan involved in the offense and Eric fouled out. But Ashbrook's going to be one of the better 4-A teams in the state and we knew that it was going to be a physical game. We thought we held our own on the boards."

Kings Mountain finished with one more field goal than Ashbrook, but the Green Wave hit 13 of 19 free throws to win.

Sipe said he was especially pleased with his team's transition game and the bench.

"We went three deep at point guard and I didn't see a letdown there between Todd Huntsinger, Jarvis Bell and Maurice Jarrett," he said. "We got good play off the bench from Donny Minor, who scored 10 points, and C.T. Williams played well down low. He's 5-11 and was battling kids 6-8 and 6-4. Justin Champion came off the bench and played well also. He's probably the most physical player we have. He's our banger."

With more rugged non-conference games ahead, Sipe said it will be important for his players to keep a good attitude.

"We don't start conference play until January, and we have to remember that," he said. "This game can only make us better in the long run. This is a good group that we're working with. Hopefully, we'll turn things around and win some games."

■ Kings Mountain's girls maintained a 10-point cushion most of the first half, and still led at the end of three quarters only to see Ashbrook come on strong at the end to win the game.

The Lady Mountaineers led 15-10 at the first quarter break, 27-20 at intermission and 40-38

going into the fourth quarter.

A 6-0 run late in the game gave Ashbrook the lead. Kings Mountain had several opportunities to get back in the game at the foul line, but couldn't connect.

Tonika Wallace scored 14 of her 20 points in the second half to lead the Ashbrook scoring. Tameeka Anderson of Kings Mountain led all scorers with 25 points, and Karen Queen added 12.

"In the first half we played our game plan," said Coach Leigh. "We tried to control Wallace and be very aggressive. We played with a lot of spirit, but we missed some lay-ups and free throws that hurt us."

"The second half, we came out a little bit flat and Ashbrook came out hot. As far as the loss, we're going to have some losses, but our girls played hard. I was a little disappointed that we didn't have any more fight than we did when we were trying to come back. We lost the defensive intensity that we had in the first half."

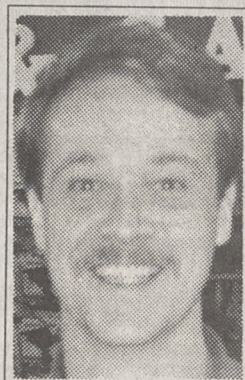

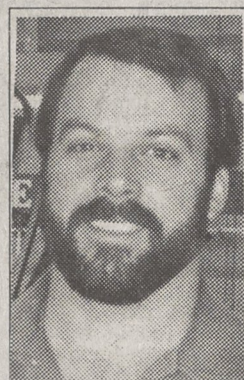
