and sewer rate increase at July 1, 1993 and \$79,000 from a two percent water and sewer rate increase at July 1, 1994.

Savings in FY 1994-95 from debt service and lease payment purchases in the water and sewer fund were projected to be \$136,179 and in the electric fund savings from peak shaving in 1994-95 were estimated at \$150,000.

The charts projected that capital outlay budget targets of \$200,000 for natural gas, \$200,000 for electric, and \$600,000 for water and sewer would be "in easy reach" by the 1995-96 fiscal year.
