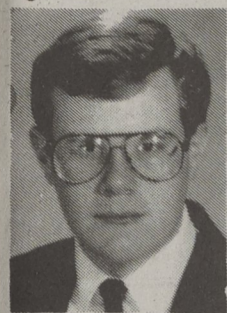


## Moore named to UNC Board

Kings Mountain law student Tim Moore wants to be the second student from Kings Mountain on the University of North Carolina board of governors.

The son of Jean and Rick Moore, he is running for the seat because he wants to see more young people on the eight-member

board. Moore, a law student at Oklahoma City University, hopes to join fellow Kings Mountain resident Mark Bibbs, who is currently on the board.

This week Senator Dennis Davis of Cleveland County placed Moore's name in nomination for the Senate UNC Board of Governors and also nominated Hoyt Q. Bailey of Shelby to fill at-large seats. Davis said the election will probably be prior to March 28.

Moore also has the endorsement of Rep. John Weatherly of Kings Mountain.

Moore is a graduate of Kings Mountain High School and the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill, Class of 1982. He holds a bachelor's degree in political science and is current chairman of the Young Republican club in Cleveland County. Last summer, he interned at the law firm of Hamrick, Mauney, Flowers and Martin in Shelby.

## Midgett leads duckpin bowling

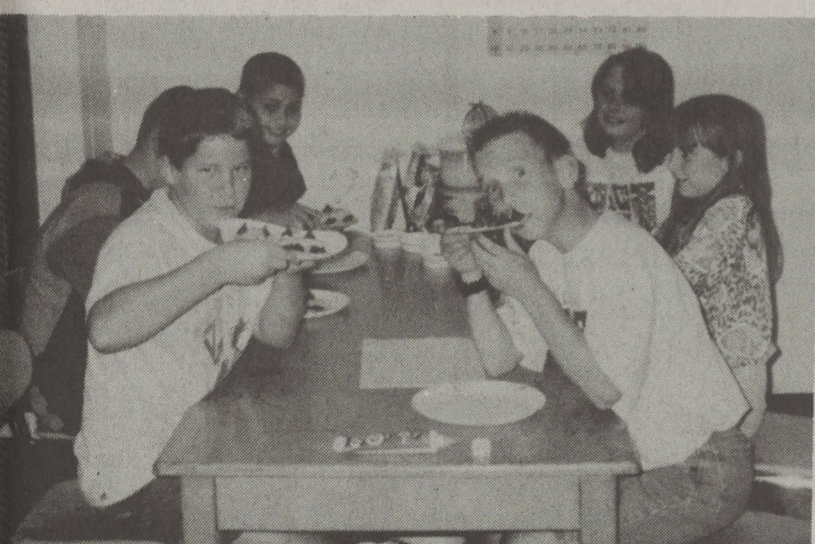
