With spring's arrival, do-it-yourself recycling is swinging in high gear thanks to efforts of Kings Mountain Garden Club and the City of Kings Mountain.

Backyard composting is actually less work than bagging and drag ging to the curb, says Public Works Supt. Karl Moss who says homeowners can buy the bins at about half what they would pay for an equivalent bin anywhere else.

Moss says the 100 percent recycled plastic bins are simple to use alogs for \$90-\$100 plus shipping.

because they require no assembly the homeowner simply unfolds the three foot by three foot bin which may be used without turning the material. No additives are required. The Groundskeeper bin is avail-


