ed a \$2.8 million bond referendum for Cleveland Community College Tuesday by 446 votes as a light trickling of voters went to the

The unofficial count was 1,903 against and 1,457 for as 3,368 voters went to the polls.

Only 7.96 percent of the county's 42,307 registered voters in the county turned out to vote.

It was a disappointing blow for community college officials who lost \$2.2 million in matching funds from the state - a total of \$5 million had the bonds passed for a classroom and training center for fire, rescue and law enforcement personnel and future land purchase.

Ruth Wilson, elections board official, said the special referendum, the only item on the ballot, had not been well publicized although there was apparently no organized opposition. College officials had been out in the county giving programs to churches and civic clubs and schools county wide had endorsed the referendum.





