Silver anniversary August 15 for Chet and Joyce Buckner

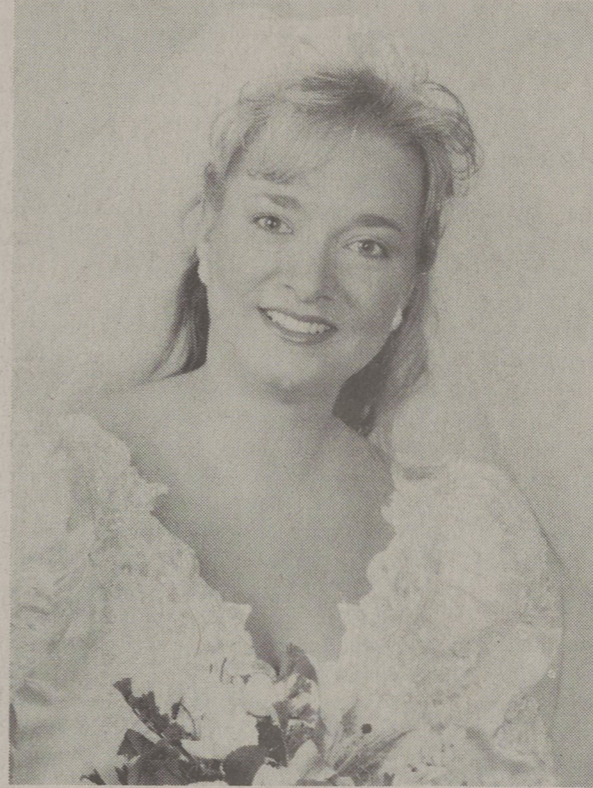
Chet and Joyce Downey Buckner will celebrate their 25th wedding anniversary August 15.
