17th straight victory

Kings Mountain's Mountaineers found out Friday night that their new wide-open offense has a long way to go - but neither Coach Ron Massey nor the fans that packed the Kings Mountain bleachers could find fault with the Mountaineers in their 28-0 pasting by defending state 4-A champion Crest.

The Mountaineers and Chargers, whose offenses and defenses are very similar, excited the crowd with a lot of long runs and passes. Very early on, though, it was evident that the Chargers' experience and depth would win out.

Crest and Kings Mountain put up almost identical numbers on the statistical charts, with Crest compiling 193 yards total offense to 191 for the Mountaineers. The big difference on the scoreboard, though, was because Crest took advantage of some big defensive plays to score touchdowns and also stopped a couple of potential KM scoring drives early in the game.

After an early exchange of punts, Crest drove 52 yards for the go-ahead score with Anthony Davis going over from 20 yards 19 out with 7:16 left in the first quarter. Adam Stewart's PAT made the score 7-0. A 20-yard pass to Wiley

Petty set up the score.

The Mountaineers drove into Crest territory twice during the remainder of the first period and early stages of the second quarter, but each time the marches were stopped by pass interceptions. The second interception went through the KM receiver's hands into the hands of the Chargers' Rocky Kimble, who raced down the visitor's sidelines 72 yards for a touchdown. Stewart's PAT with 10:28 remaining gave the Chargers a 14-0 lead.

Crest drove 47 yards following a KM punt to take a 21-0 lead with 6:39 remaining in the half. Davis, who finished with 78 yards rushing in 12 carries, had a big 18-yard run for a first down at the KM 18, a nine-yard burst for a first down at the three, and then a three-yard run up the middle for the touchdown.

Kings Mountain's Eric Tate intercepted a pass to stop another potential Crest touchdown drive in the final seconds of the first half, but on the second half kickoff KM's Corey Jones mishandled the ball at the 12 and Crest recovered. Three running plays by Davis re-sulted in a three-yard touchdown run to close out the scoring.

Neither team really threatened in

the second half as the Charger punter kept the Mountaineers backed up on their side of the field, and Crest Coach Mike Stewart used the big lead to get a lot of players into the game. After his three runs on the 12-yard touchdown drive, Davis didn't touch the ball again but sophomore running back Rusty Spikes came on to gain 41 yards in 12 carries.

Kings Mountain Coach Ron Massey was disappointed with his team's turnovers - one fumble and two interceptions - but he was pleased with the effort his players
