Kings Mountain Police Report Eckerd Drug Store reports robbery

Eckerd Drug Store at 608 E. King Street was reportedly robbed Thursday night by a man who bought a package of gum and then reached into the cash drawer and took a handful of money.

The robber hurriedly left the store. The clerk was unharmed.

Chief Bob Hayes said that about 7:20 p.m. a man reportedly approached a 17-year-old cashier to purchase a 27 cent package of chewing gum. When the teenager rang up the purchase, the man reached across the counter and grabbed a handful of bills.

The man, described as black and in his late teens with a slender build, fled on foot, with an undisclosed amount of cash. He was last seen wearing a large, multicolored toboggan cap pulled down across his eyes, Hayes said.

Fuel spill closes road

The Kings Mountain Police Department closed a portion of U. S. 74 for more than an hour Thursday after a tractor trailer's fuel tank was punctured, spilling more than 30 gallons of diesel fuel on the roadway.

Indiana trucker Matthew Geer told officers he hit a piece of metal in the road which punctured the fuel tank.

Kings Mountain firemen tried to plug the fuel tank but the makeshift seal did not hold and the Cleveland County Hazardous Materials Team was called to the scene at 3:30 p.m. Several garbage cans were used to contain the fuel that was pumped out of the tank.

Police rerouted traffic off U.S. 74 and onto N. C. 161 east of the spill site.

Police said no injuries were reported. Also on the scene were Cleveland County Deputy Fire Marshal Dewey Cook, the Highway Patrol and N. C. Division of Motor Vehicles personnel.
