

GROVER - It was standingroom-only at the Town board meeting Monday night for one of the shortest meetings on record, 20 minutes.

Councilman Robbie Sides suggested the board postpone the hiring of a new full-time policeman until after the municipal election Tuesday in which three seats were to be decided and the tabling of awarding bids for the weapons.

Sides also made the motion that the board delay the sale of outdated weapons for more bids.

"The bids are way too low for these guns and I hope we can get some more money for them," said Mayor Ronald Queen.
